ABOUT THE ARTISTS & PERFORMERS

- 1 Physicist **Dr. Sandy Eix** is the Science Learning Lead at Vancouver's Science World. She has been inventing shows, programs and exhibits for Science World for more than twelve years and is instrumental in the invention of new ways of learning about science.
- 1 **Dr. Claudia Krebs** is a senior instructor at the University of British Columbia's Department of Cellular & Physiological Sciences and a member of the Department's Education Research Group.
- 2 Taiwanese-born Vancouver pianist **Tina Chang** has always enjoyed exploring the versatility of the piano. She was most recently on tour with the Vancouver Opera in Schools' *Jack Pine* where she was pianist and music director.
- 2 **Cris Derksen** is a classically trained cellist. She has worked with a wide variety of musicians, including Tanya Tagaq, Kinnie Starr and Kanye West.
- 2 **Melody Mercredi** is a classical singer and currently a soprano in the Vancouver Opera chorus. She will play the role of Barbarina in the Vancouver Opera's performance of Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*.
- 3 **Martin Fisk** is a Vancouver-based percussionist and a member of the Fringe Percussion quartet. He has also had the honour of performing with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Vancouver Opera Orchestra, Vancouver New Music, Red Shift Music Society and Turning Point.
- 3 **Mark Takeshi McGregor** is a Vancouver-based flutist and has established himself as a leading interpreter of the music of our time. He has performed around the world in such places as Berlin, New York City, Copenhagen and Israel.
- 5 The Vancouver Art Gallery **Teen Art Group (TAG)** engages young people age-14-to-18 with contemporary art, artists and ideas through workshops, discussion, performance and exhibition tours.
- 5 Visual artist and classically trained singer **Carol Sawyer** has been performing improvised music for more than 10 years. Dedicated to exploring the full expressive potential of the human voice, Sawyer's musical approach connects to spontaneity, imagination, a sense of character and attentive listening.
- 9 **Natalie Purschwitz** is a Vancouver-based artist and clothing designer. She has shown her work internationally and is currently engaged in a one-year project during which she will only wear things she has made herself.
- 10 **Katie Henderson** is a Vancouver-based architect and educator. Katie has designed numerous residential and public buildings around Vancouver and teaches architecture at Arts Umbrella in Vancouver for ages-6-to-12.
- 10 **Kristen Roos** is a sound artist who leads sound exploration walks as a part of his practice. His writing and sounds have been featured in the Errant Bodies publication "Radio Territories" and the forthcoming "Islands of Resistance: Pirate radio in Canada."
