# GETTING TO THE VANCOUVER ART GALLERY



The Vancouver Art Gallery is located in downtown Vancouver.

The address is: 750 Hornby St, Vancouver, BC V6Z 2H7

Sometimes there are large events outside the Gallery. It can be busy and noisy during these times, but it will be quieter inside.

### **INSIDE THE BUILDING**



You will enter the building into the lobby.

First, you will go to Admissions,

Then, you will go to the lockers.

From the lobby, you can also go to the Gallery Store or Bistro.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**





The Gallery is wheelchair accessible.

Wheelchairs are also available to visitors upon request.

If you require additional assistance, ask a security guard, volunteer or receptionist when you arrive.

#### **CAN RESOURCE KITS**



Canucks Autism Network (CAN) Resource Kits are available to borrow during your visit. Pick up, and return to Admissions.



#### TICKETS TO THE GALLERY




Ticket pricing and information can be found here.

#### **LOCKERS**





Lock your coat, backpack, umbrella or any large items in a locker.

These items are not allowed past the Gallery Entrance.

Follow the instructions on display to ensure your items are locked.

#### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT



In the Lobby there is a unique land acknowledgment welcoming visitors into the Gallery. It speaks to the gallery's values and mission.


#### **GALLERY STAFF & VOLUNTEERS**

#### **RULES FOR THE GALLERY**

- Look for signs that tell you the rules
- No food or drink
- No umbrellas or backpacks
- No flash photos, selfie sticks or tripods
- Do not touch the art!

#### **ENTERING THE GALLERY SPACE**




The lobby can be noisy at times with people coming and going.

#### **EXPLORE EXHIBITIONS**

Find a quiet space if you want a longer break.


#### **EATING AT THE GALLERY**

Enter from the concrete staircase beside the Admissions desk in the lobby, or the elevator through the Annex Building.


## **GALLERY STORE**



Before you leave the Gallery, you can visit the Gallery Store!


